



Monopoly Bracelet

The type of resin we used here differs from the two-part resin used in the Together in Time bracelet in that it is bakeable. Most materials and tools used are the same, but you will also need Monopoly game pieces and imagery, bottlecaps instead of watch tins, a toaster oven, a small amount of polymer clay and clear ultra-thick embossing powder. We used jump rings instead of washers and purchased a toggle clasp.



1 Size your imagery to fit inside the bottlecaps. (If you're attaching the caps to a brass inlay strip, you must do that now.) You can use a medium like Diamond Glaze to adhere the paper images, but you will need to secure three-dimensional objects with tiny balls of polymer clay.



2 Turn your toaster oven to 350°F (177°C) (oven temperatures will vary, so you may need to experiment). Fill the collaged bottlecaps with ultra-thick embossing powder and bake until the pieces melt clear. Let everything cool, then drill holes into the sides of the bottlecaps, if you didn't already attach them to a brass inlay strip (it's okay to drill through the resin, too!) Assemble the bracelet with jump rings, then add a toggle clasp of your choice to finish.
